In our verse of the day, we learn that prior to being able to know who we are, it is important to answer the identity question concerning who Jesus is.

In our verse of the day, Jesus knew that people were talking about Him, so He asked the disciples, "Who do men say that I am?" They gave many answers. Then Jesus asked them, "Who do you say that I am?" From sharing what the world said about Him, Jesus strategically turned the focus from outside to within, having the disciples personally reflect for themselves His identity.
